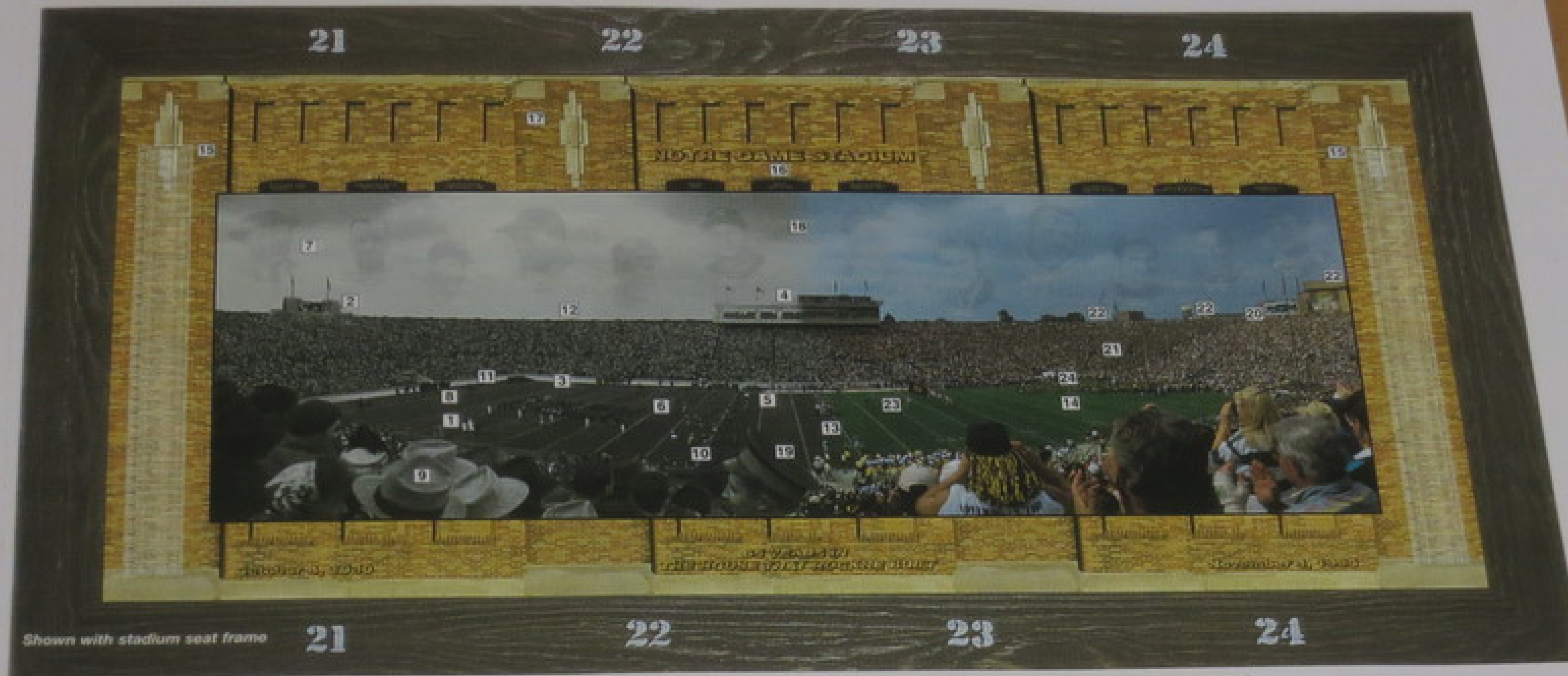

1930 to 1995, the years when the bricks of tradition and the mortar of mystique grew within the original brick arena commonly known as "The House That Rockne Built". This 17" x 36" Commemorative Limited Edition Lithograph creates a historical time capsule by digitally melding nearly 30 photographs representing a seamless 65 year time-line progression from the grayscale first game on October 4, 1930 to the colorful last game in the historic stadium before its renovation on November 4, 1995.

Follow the "Notables at a Glance" legend at the right which points out many of the historic subtleties which exude from this artwork. Hundreds of conceptualization, research, approval and production hours have gone into this seamless rendering of the original house that Rockne built.
