Adoration All Day.

You have, by virtue of the courtesy of the Bishop of Fort Wayne, the privilege of exposition of the Blessed Sacrament throughout the day every First Friday. Today you are asked to offer your adoration for the intentions of the Bishop. As an aid to devotion, students are accustomed to vest in cassock and surplice and take places in the sanctuary for the adoration. Please do not leave the Blessed Sacrament alone at any time during the day.

Tomorrow For the Team.

Another traditional custom at Notre Dame is the reception of Holy Communion for the team on the day of the game. Friday and Saturday usually belong to the team; Friday was taken away for the Bishop this time; you can make up for it by bringing a friend with you to Holy Communion tomorrow morning.
