A Crucifix For Your Room.

Some three hundred crucifixes were distributed during the Mission. There should be a crucifix in every room -- and the decorations should conform to the crucifix. There are a few in stock at the Sorin Hall pamphlet rack, and more will be ordered for those who want them.

Six-Thirty is Proposed.

A member of the football team proposes 6:30 as the hour for the Rosary Devotions. This hour would exclude the waiters, and would out in on recreation at a time when rest is very helpful -- immediately after a meal; it would also (although this would not be a mortal sin) break up the after-supper confessions in the basement chapel, the longest continuous tradition in the history of daily Communion at Notre Dame. (During the past five years there has not been a single night without at least one penitent, and during three and a half years before that, there were only seven nights when no one came to be shrived.) What other hour can you suggest?

Spread Out A Bit.

The basement chapel is taxed to capacity these mornings. There will be some relief of the congestion if students from Morrissey Hall will receive in Howard Hall until their chapel is finished. Father Margraf will distribute Holy Communion for the benefit of Morrissey Hall students at 6:50 every morning in the South Chapel of Howard Hall. Those who wish to go to confession can still come to the basement chapel; it will be appreciated if others will make use of the hall chapel.

That Saturday Night Dance.

It is public dancing that is forbidden on Saturday nights by the statutes of the Fort Wayne diocese. Football dances do not come under the headef public dances if their attendance is restricted to students and alumni and their families.
