The devil throws out extraordinary temptations on Good Friday, and he seems to get a special kick out of disgracing Notre Dame on that day. One year the Chicago papers carried a story about a fight in a low-down cafe early Friday morning in which they alleged Notre Dame students took the chief role. Again, three students were arrested for being in jovial mood and singing Dixie on the curb in front of a local theatre; the management is said to have caused the arrest because the amateur entertainers were keeping people out of the show.

Sorin Chapel Closed!

Get this straight. Hand it on to the next man. Don't come around later and say you didn't know about it. This is the official announcement of the program of the next three days. And it contains important restrictions.

The Sorin Hall Chapel will be closed tomorrow, Friday, and Saturday.

Holy Communion cannot be received at all on Good Friday; Viaticum is administered to the dying on that day, and the celebrant of the Mass of the Presanctified receives, but there is no other reception of Holy Communion.

On Holy Thursday there will be no distribution of Holy Communion after the Mass, which takes place in the church at seven o'clock. From six till six forty-five you may receive in the basement chapel that morning.

On Holy Saturday the only distribution will be during the Mass, at 7:30.

This is the general law of the Church, from which we have received no dispensation, so you will have to be content with it.

Holy Week Services.

The Liturgy of the Church is carried out in full at Notre Dame during Holy Week. Each evening at 7:30 Tenebrae is sung. This is the office of Matins and Lauds of the following day. The music of the Lamentations, which come at the beginning of the office (within the first fifteen minutes) is especially moving. The Thursday Tenebrae will be sung this evening. The other services are as follows:

Holy Thursday: Mass - 7:00 a.m., followed by Procession to the Repository, and adoration all day and all night.

Good Friday: Mass of the Presanctified - 8:00 a.m., with singing of the Passion.
Way of the Cross - 3:00 p.m.

Holy Saturday: Blessing of Easter Fire, Water, and Candle, 6:00 a.m.
Mass, 7:30 a.m.
