Early Communion Tomorrow.

Ask your rector what plans he has for early Masses tomorrow. If you wish to receive Holy Communion before the first Mass in your hall chapel, come to Sorin Hall.

The first Mass in Sorin will be at five o'clock. Holy Communion will be distributed there as early as you like. If you wish to receive before five, make the fact known today or this evening. The distribution through the morning hours will continue as usual.

Go To Confession Today.

Don't count on being able to get to confession tomorrow morning. Priests will be hearing in the basement and Sorin chapels, but they will very likely be very busy, and your chance of being heard will be lessened by the crowd.

In Sorin confessions will be heard all day, except after supper, when they are heard in the basement chapel; in the hall chapels after night prayer you will have your usual opportunities.

Holy Communion for the Team.

Yesterday's Bulletin stressed sufficiently the importance of your moral backing for the team; tomorrow morning give the boys the benefit of your spiritual backing.

Specials Are Dangerous.

The accident rate is higher on special trains than on regulars; regular schedules provide more elements of safety. Receive the Sacraments before you start; you are ready then if your time comes this week-end.

Change In Rosary Devotions.

Saturday: 5:30 in the Basement chapel.

Miraculous Medals Today.

At the close of the Rosary Devotions this afternoon (at 5:00 o'clock) there will be another enrollment in the Miraculous Medal. This is the medal which carries with it the plenary indulgence for each recitation of six Our Father's, Hail Mary's, and Glory be to the Father's. (To gain this indulgence one must be in the state of grace and must wear the medal suspended from his neck.)

The Founder's Day Mass.

The solemn Mass in commemoration of Founder's Day (the feast of St. Edward, Father Sorin's patron) will begin at 8:00 o'clock tomorrow. Student attendance is not required this year, but those who are here should be present and pray for the success of Notre Dame.
