He was given a medal of St. Anthony and told to say a prayer to the Saint and go back and look just where he had looked before. Within ten minutes he was back to say that he had found the bill in his waste basket -- a good place for old paper.

The same thing happened a couple of weeks ago for student who had lost a check. The same thing has happened time and again -- so much so that there are few St. Anthony medals left.

A priest here obtained the cure of an insane patient by a novena of Masses to St. Anthony not long ago. The man had been pronounced incurable. The priest is now fulfill ing a promise he hade at the time, of soliciting three hundreds dollars for the construction in India of a chapel in honor of St. Anthony, the donations from individuals not to exceed one dollar. If any student friends of St. Anthony wish to partake in this good work, they can apply to the Prefect of Religion for the priest's name.

The Third Sunday.

The third Sunday of the month at Notre Dame is dedicated in a special way to the Bless Sacrament. It has three special features:

- 1. Several years ago the Rt. Rev. Bishop of Fort Wayne granted us the privilege of having the High Mass on that day a Mass of Exposition, to enable the students to make an Hour of Adoration once a month without inconvenience;
- 2. The Holy Father has granted a plenary indulgence to all students and members of the faculty who receive Holy Communion on the third Sunday of the month and pray for his intentions.
- 3. The collection taken up in the Masses on the third Sunday of the month are for the Foreign Missions -- our share in the work of the heroic pioneers of the Faith who labor under tropic suns to baptize and save the souls of those who still "sit in darkness and the shadow of death."
