Novena For The Team.

Beginning Friday and ending Saturday of the following week, the day of the Southern California Game, we will have a private Novena for the team. This Novena can run concurrently with the one you are making for Van Wallace. Offer your Holy Communion for both intentions, and each day say the Memorare for the team while you say the Litany of the Blessed Virgin for Van. You will find the Memorare on the Morning Prayer card. (If you haven't one of these, get one at the Pamphlet Rack.)

Broken Promises.

Last Thursday your attention was called to the fact that hundreds of promises were made during the Army Game -- promises of prayers, of Novenas, of Rosaries, of good conduct, and the like. A promise made and not kept is worse than no promise made. If any of you made foolish promises that you can't keep, or that will be difficult for you to keep, ask your confessors to be excused from them or to have them commuted to something else.

Religion or Discipline; Take Your Choice.

The Prefect of Religion is under the impression that many students here are unaware of the activities of another very important department of the University, the Department of Discipline. The disciplinarians, all of them priests or religious, would prefer that religion guide your footsteps; when it doesn't, they may find it their duty to trail you. The Prefect of Discipline has given us for publication a report, dated November 14, giving the dismissals from the University to that date. A separate Bulletin would be required for a report covering the past week-end. The report follows:

Dismissals during October:

- 6 for visiting restricted districts;
- 3 for unauthorized absence from place of residence and drinking intoxicating liquor;
- l for owning and using automobile drove to Navy Game. Dismissals during November:
 - 3 for unauthorized absence from place of residence;
 - 3 for visiting restricted districts for drink;
 - 1 for going to the Army Game without permission;
 - 4 for visiting restricted districts.

That's twenty-one. The rest of you who are still sound of mind and heart and limb can thank God that you are, and you can take your choice for the rest of your stay at Notre Dame: religion or discipline. Think of your mother when you make your choice.
