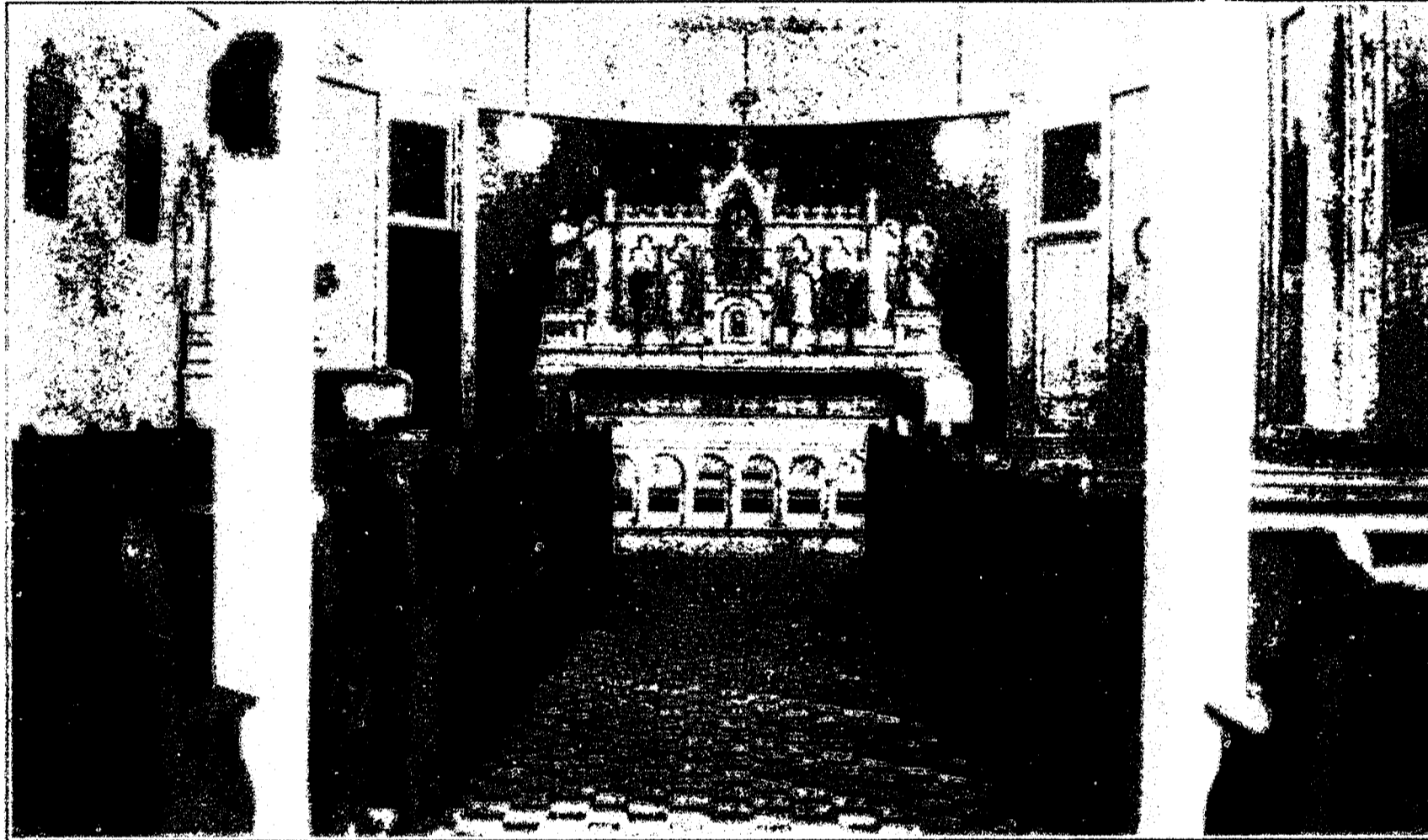

DISTINCTION



This little chapel, with a capacity of about 110 persons, probably has several unique distinctions. Last year it was the scene of 57,014 student Holy Communion; last Friday morning the number was 523, a new record for an individual day. It is attended constantly for seven hours every morning for the reception of the Sacraments; during the rest of the twenty-four hours they may be received on request. Holy Communion has been distributed in this chapel at every hour between 12:10 a. m. and 9:15 p. m. It is the oldest residence-hall chapel in the United States, and has been in daily use for forty-two years. Its privileges are intended mainly for the convenience of off-campus students.

If Holy Communion can help you in your studies It can also help you to overcome your faults; It can help your parents; it can help the Poor Sou's; It can make you the man your mother thinks you are.
