Frank Patrick Burke, of Walsh Hall, a junior in Arts and Letters, died Monday morning at 9:06, at a hospital in Michigan City, as a result of injuries received in an auto accident shortly after midnight as he and five companions were returning to Motre Dame from the Prom at Rosary College. His two sisters from St. Mary's were at his bedside. He was unconscious, but he received Extreme Unction.

The University extends its condolence and its prayers to the stricken family. His father, Frank Burke, Sr., is an alumnus of the Class of 'D3; his uncle, Rev. Joseph Burke, C.S.C., is President of St. Edward's University, Austing, Jexas, and was for fourteen years an executive of the University of Notre Dame.

God was very good to Frank, and his family will treasure a host of happy memories of his cheerful young life. But no memory will be sweeter to them than the recollection of his devotion to Holy Communion. He was a faithful client of the Sorin Chapel, especially this year, and the store of graces and merits he piled up there stood him in good stead when God called him. Judgment held no terror for him, we may be sure, for he knew his Divine Judge in the Breaking of Bread.
