Novena for Exams. The midsemester tests are scheduled to begin Nov. 9; your novena should begin not later than Saturday, October 31 - day after tomorrow.

More Room in the Sorin Chapel. Dillon Hall has moved out of the Sorin chapel and out of the cafeteria. Off-campus students who have been loafing may receive more attention now (the inevitable list is up to date; you are fooling no one but yourself); and the campus students who breakfast in the cafeteria may drop into the Sorin chapel on their way to breakfast without fear of fighting for a place in the breakfast line.

No Time for Thanksgiving. A correspondent protests that the Mass in his hall chapel is said so late that between Holy Communion and the breakfast hour there is not sufficient time for thanksgiving. Any student who finds himself in this predicament may come to the church for his morning devotions. There he will find Masses at 6:25 and 6:35, with almost continuous distribution of Holy Communion - and with ample time for all the preparation and thanksgiving he wants to make. (The best preparation, of course, is devout assistance at Mass.)

Confirmation. The Rt. Rev. Bishop of Fort Wayne will confirm a class at St. Hedwige's Church, South Bend, Friday evening. The pastor has given permission for students to be confirmed with this class. Candidates for this Sacrament will report to the Prefect of Religion for final instructions tomorrow morning. They are reminded now that they must be in the state of grace to receive this Sacrament licitly, and they should receive Holy Communion in the morning before they are confirmed.
