Questions From The Questionnaire.

94. Is killing one's self ever permitted?

Ans. Not direct killing. A man may risk his life in a good deed if there is a proportionately grave cause for his so doing - and the graver the risk the graver must be the cause.

95. Please handle the question of mortal sin.

Ans. Which question? Unforgiven mortal sin puts a man in hell for all eternity; what else do you want to know about it?

96. What is the new promise to be made in the case of a mixed marriage?
