For the Vacation Victims.

In order to remind you of your duty of prayers for the departed, the 7:00 Mass Sunday will be offered for the repose of the souls of the following students:

Tom Spalding and his cousin from St. Mary's, killed in a train wreck in Kentucky on their way home for the Christmas holidays, 1917.

Wm. Dockman, killed by a train in Kentucky, Easter holidays, 1924.

George O'Leary, killed in an auto accident near Ann Arbor, Michigan, on his way home in June, 1926.

Gerald Puffan, killed by an auto while he was returning from a dance at St. Mary's on the first day of the final examinations, 1932.

For Eugene Kelly.

The 8:00 Mass Sunday will be offered for the repose of the soul of Eugene Kelly, who died at home during the Christmas holidays, 1927. There will also be an anniversary Mass offered for him on December 26.

For Norbert Steyskal.

The 9:00 High Mass Sunday will be offered for the repose of the soul of Norbert Steyskal, '27, who died on December 18, 1930, after a short but very distinguished career as a civil engineer in New Mexico.
