Knute Rockne's Anniversary Mass.

Tomorrow (Saturday) at 6:25, in Sacred Heart Church, an Anniversary Requiem Mass will be sung for the repose of the soul of Lnute Rockne. We hope that you will give it more thought than you did the Mass for your deceased schoolmate, Bruce Craham. Only 235 Holy Communions were received by students at that Mass yesterday morning. Not half of that group were seniors - in fact, less than 20% of the senior class attended the Mass. Bruce deserved better than that - and so does Mute Rockne. This is a soft generation, of course; early rising in cold weather is out:

Only Three Masses Sunday.

Perhaps we should send a messenger to each one of you to make sure that you understand the change of schedule announced for next Sunday morning. But even that would do no good. So many of you have five senses and none of them working.

Whether or not it will do any good we repeat the announcement: There will be only three Masses for students next Sunday - at 6:00, 6:05, and 8:15. Breakfast will be at 7:45. The change is made necessary because two hours are usually required for the High Mass, which is preceded by the blessing of palms and the procession, and a full hour is required for the second Mass, which usually has the largest number of Holy Communions of any Sunday Mass of the schoolyear.
