How Would King David Have Sung Of Our Lord In The Blessed Sacrament?

David lived centuries. before Our Blessed Lord's time on earth. He had no inkling of the intimacy Christians would one day enjoy with their God Incarnate---truly, really and substantially present in the Blessed Sacrament.
