



DEAR FATHER FRANK:

An old adage has it that bad pennies come home to roost. Naturally, then, when a couple of Notre Dame men find themselves in a real jam, they turn instinctively homeward. . . . A squad of Holy Cross men has been detailed, as you know, to take care of the apostolate among the aborigines of Bacca diocese. The work progresses year by year and at present there are eight established missions exclusively devoted to the conversion of the aboriginal tribes of Kymensingh district. So far twelve thousand Garos have been received into the Church. . . . This "parish" dedicated to Saint Theresa comprises 150 square miles of Garo jungle, bristling with Garo souls, washed and unwashed. To date 2400 have been lured away from paganism and formally adopted by the Little Flower. . . . But recently the mission plant, cur pride and joy, went down for the short count. A howling cyclone jumped the fence, completely wrecked the school and decapitated the Sisters' dispensary. . . . (to be continued later).
