The Wedding Garment.

Be on time for Mass Sunday. There is no sermon but there is a very appropriate Gospel. The Gospel is Christ's own parable of the wedding feast and the guest who received pretty rough treatment for not wearing the wedding garment. A little interpretation in advance will help you to understand the Gospel better.

The wedding garment of Christ's day was a robe befitting the royal marriage feast-ivities. The robe was provided from the royal wardrobe for each guest. Easily obtainable, lack of it spoke carelessness, disrespect and contempt for the host and King.

And here's the point to bear in mind. The wedding garment represents or signifies the STATE OF GRACE. See what happens, according to Christ, to him who isn't clothed at the wedding feast with the wedding garment or the STATE OF GRACE.

Incidentally, when you attend the Eucharistic Banquet, which is the Sacrifice of the Mass, in Sacred Heart Church or in any hall chapel, please, gentlemen, be properly attired. That doesn't mean formal dress. It does mean, however, clothes in keeping with the dignity of the King.

Heatness and tidiness reflect a little effort, therefore, reverence toward Christ the King. It reflects also your home training. Don't ever confuse slovenliness with Notre Dame virility.
