Perhaps I should add that if the doctors find the leg is not knitting properly under the present treatment, they will have to put pins in the bones to hold them in alignment -- a thing which they are very reluctant to do since it involves operating on paralyzed tissue. A cast is out of the question because of the practical certainty of pressure sores developing. So, may I ask for an extra Ave on Monday, even if you have been so generous already?

I'll let you know as soon as the X-ray is taken what goes on. Will you please thank everyone for me?
