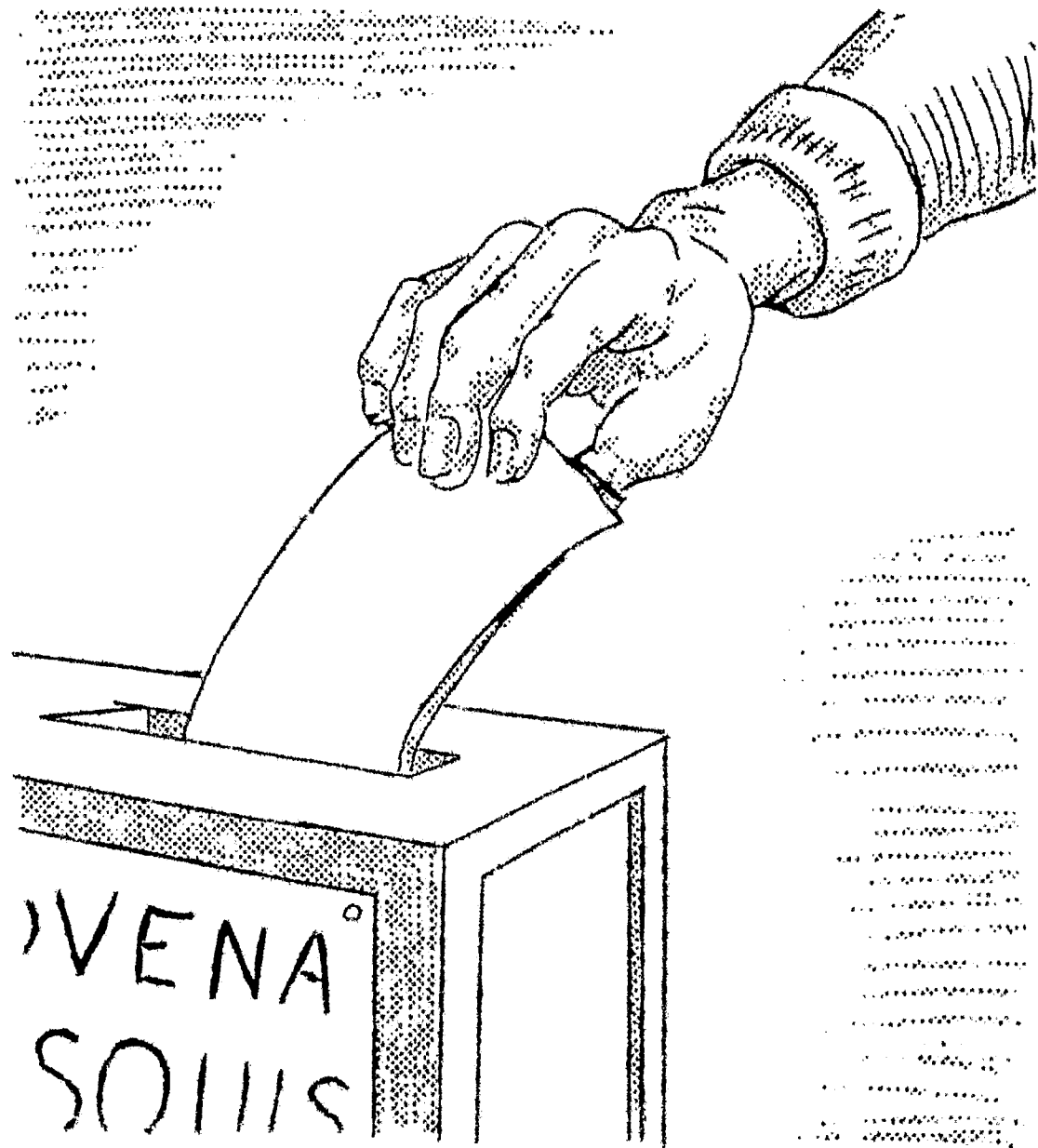

Hand In The Names Of...

deceased relatives and friends you wish to help by the Novena for Poor Souls. A Novena of Masses will be offered for these souls, beginning Monday. The lists of names dropped into the Novena Box will be collected and taken to the altar on which the Novena Masses will be offered.

Jot down now the names you have in mind, and run down with the list to the Novena Box in your hall.

Novena For Poor Souls Begins Monday.

Big weekend or not, get up Monday, All Souls Day, and assist the souls in Purgatory. On Monday every priest has the privilege of offering three Masses. Your sacrifice of sleep joined to Christ's sacrifice will hurry many souls to heaven.

Novena Services Every Night at 7:00 In Church.

As part of the Novena for the Poor Souls, there will be Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament and the Rosary in the Church at 7:00 every evening. Go to the Church after supper. This devotion will take the place of the regular night prayer in the hall.

Gain Plenary Indulgences Sunday and Monday For the Poor Souls.

You can gain a PLENARY INDULGENCE for a Poor Soul every time you visit the Main Church or any hall chapel and say 6 Our Fathers, 6 Hail Marys and 6 Glory Be To The Fathers for the intention of our Holy Father the Pope. This special indulgence can be gained from Sunday noon (Nov. 1) until Monday midnight (Nov. 2).

NOTE: Confession and Communion are necessary conditions for gaining the indulgences, so try to get to confession before the weekend, tonight preferably, in your hall or in Dillon, Cavanaugh or Zahm (until 10:00).

After saying the required 6 Our Fathers, etc., step outside the door of the church or chapel for a second. This concludes a visit. You may return immediately and begin another visit.

Solemn Requiem Monday Morning.

As part of Notre Dame's Centenary Program there will be a Solemn High Mass offered Monday morning in the Church by Father Hugh O'Donnell C.S.C., for all the deceased faculty members and students of the past one hundred years. The student body is invited to attend this Mass.
