The Mass Missal Used By The Chaplains.

A Military Missal, Missale Castrense, has been distributed by Chaplains' Aid Association to all the Catholic chaplains in service. New kits prepared for chaplains entering service will have this Missal as standard equipment. The present privilege of Chaplains gives them the right to substitute for the Mass of the day one of the following Masses, according to the character of the day:

- 1. On Sundays and major feasts; the Mass of Trinity Sunday.
- 2. Throughout Easter Week: the Hass of Easter Sunday.
- 3. On all other days, one of the following:
 - a) The votive lass of the Blessed Virgin.
 - b) The votive Mass in Time of War.
 - c) The Mass of the Dead.

A novel feature of the Military Missal is the Sunday Missal of Father Stedman bound into the cover. This feature provides the chaplain with the Epistle and Gospels in English.

You are invited to attend the Afternoon Hass at 4:45 p.m. daily except Saturday and Sunday. Only the Navy men have the privilege of receiving Holy Communion in the afternoon. If inquiries are made of you by anyone in the Service about the Communion Fast tell them that one must fast four hours from solid food and one hour from liquids.
