What Do You Say?

"Dear Father:

"We have just finished a little session in the room and I have been selected to send you some of our observations. Father, we noticed in the Bulletin that each 7:00 Novena service in the Church is for the Poor Souls and especially for one of Notre Dame's World War II Dead. Last night we prayed for Joe Foley '37, the sixth on the list of the dead.

"Why stop the Novena at the end of the nine days? Can't we keep on having the night services at least until every one of the 22 deceased N.D. men have had a special day of prayer given to them by all the fellows on the campus? And we think there are many fellows here who would like to have this devotion continued for their parents, friends and relatives. I for one do.

"And an added reason for the Night Devotions is this - the Student Participation in the Notre Dame Centenary Program. We have done nothing yet as a body.

"We who are enjoying the fruits of the sacrifices of the religious, teachers, students and alumni in building up N.D. should feel it a privilege to do our part on the Centenary Program. We know that prayer has accomplished wonders here. Why can't we express a little gratitude to God for the past and pray for a continuance of His blessings on the school and the students who will follow us, perhaps our own sons. Let's keep the nightly Rosary and Benediction and pray not only for the Poor Souls, but for another blessed hundred years.

"We know it is pretty hard to get all the fellows out for all the evening services. The matter might be solved by having a hall each night represent the entire campus before Christ in the Blessed Sacrament? Of course, invite everyone, but have the appointed halls come out in full force on the night they are to appear and pray for those who are not present.

"I'll bet you will get 100% cooperation from the halls on this idea. Give it a try."
