On "Pearl Harbor Day" The Church Bell Will Ring.

Monday when the bells toll at 11:55 a.m. stop and face west for one minute and pray for the men who have died in the Service. Monday is December 7, the first anniversary of the attack on Pearl Harbor. The Governor of Indiana requests that everyone heed the warning of the bells and pay the tribute of prayer to the war dead. And he suggests that during this prayer one ask himself: "Have I done all I can during the first year of this war? Am I doing my full share to assure victory?".
