Dispensation For Students Working Nights In Defense Plants.

Under ordinary conditions the Eucharistic fast begins at midnight. Because of war conditions the bishop of this diocese has dispensed defense workers from the regular law. Defense workers may receive Holy Communion the morning after working on a night shift provided they have fasted four hours from solid foods and one hour from liquids. Intoxicants may not be taken after midnight.

This dispensation makes it possible for students working in town at night to receive Holy Communion during Lent without much inconvenience. They should take advantage of the opportunity of going to Holy Communion in Dillon Hall Chapel until noon. Students who are wondering whether or not their night labors can be classified as defense work should consult their confessor about the matter.

Waiters! It's Lent For You Too

Your early morning job in the Dining Hall or elsewhere is no excuse for your missing Mass and Communion during the week. There are workers in town who rise two hours before they must report on the job so that they may attend Mass during Lent. You have far less sacrifice to make. The following facilities are available to you and other students.

- 5:30 A.M. Basement Chapel (Mass and Communion)
- 6:00 A.M. Dillon Chapel (Communion before and during Mass)
- 6:35 A.M. Dillon Chapel (Communion before Mass and during Mass)

7:20 Mass in Dillon Daily.

Off-campus students will find it convenient to assist at this Mass. It is finished before the bell for the first class. Confessions are heard during Mass. There is another late Mass in Cavanaugh Hall Chapel at 7:10 daily.
