

High Mass Sunday Starts At 8:00 (Not 8:30).

The change is for this Sunday only - Palm Sunday. There is no change in the time of the other Masses: 6, 7, and 10. The beautiful and inspiring liturgical ceremonies of Holy Week begin with Palm Sunday. Palms will be blessed before the 8:00 Mass. At this Mass the Passion as told by St. Matthew will be chanted by three priests. There will be no sermon at any of the Masses.

Next Week - The Long Gospels.

In Holy Week the Gospel stories of the Passion of Our Blessed Lord are read in the Mass: Sunday (St. Matthew), Tuesday (St. Mark), Wednesday (St. Luke), Good Friday (St. John).

Participate in these Masses intelligently. The Missal will help you. The Lenten Missa contains all the Masses for Holy Week. Buy one at the Office of the Prefect of Religion. Those who use the Daily Missal will find all the Holy Week Masses in their proper places.

Killed In Action: Lieut. Ed Phelan, Jr,

No details about the death of Lieutenant have been received other than those mentioned at the Masses last Sunday. Ed was killed in action on March 22, after serving nine months in the battle zone with the Air Force in Africa. He would have graduated in '40 if he had remained in school. Continue to pray for him.
