For Your Convenience: a 10:10 Sunday Mass

Last Sunday at Mass the pastor of the parish publicly asked the students not to attend this Mass because their presence creates interference with his parish program.

God is offended by those who arrive late for Sunday Mass. Avoid sinful negligence by rising on time. Ask your neighbor to awaken you. It can be a mortal sin to retire Saturday night, here or elsewhere, without taking precautions for awaking on time for Sunday Mass.

Those who slip out of Sunday Mass at Communion time, without sufficient excuse, offend God. A complete Mass must be heard. Remain until the prayers after Mass have been said.
