"Louis lost his life during that tragic Italian campaign early in '44. A few weeks before he was killed he wrote this in a letter home: 'In case I don't make the boat home, remember, "Many are called but few are chosen," Look at it that way, Mom, and we can't go wrong.'

"Louis didn't make the boat home. So, it remains for those whom God in His Goodness spared, to carry the torch, and proudly, -- and God grant that because their brothers silently sleep in the soft earth of many foreign lands, war will never again take its cruel toll of youth.

"I can but tell you I am and shall always be overwhelmingly grateful.
