"Some time ago I got the good news that a Care Package ordered by are was waiting for me at the Care storehouse. You over there in the land of plenty can scarcely imagine what such a parcel means to us. It is good substantial food which is badly needed, since out rations are just enough to prevent people from starving to death. Besides items which are very scarce like fat and meat, it contains things which we do not get at all as milk, eggs, cocoa, chocolate, coffee and fruits.

"In order to give you an idea of the value of your gift I will try to explain further: If you wanted to get this extra food here, you would have to buy it in the blackmarket. There it would cost, according to a very low estimate, 1500 marks. To earn this amount of money a skilled workman, a carpenter e.g., would have to work 30 weeks. So you see how precious your gift is! Unfortunately, we can only say a hearty "Thank you." But be assured that we will not forget our benefactors in our prayers and Masses. He who said, "Amen I say to you, as long as you did it to one of these, my least brethren, you did it to me," will repay you a hundredfold. For He does not allow Himself to be outdone in generosity."
