Salute To The Liturgy Club.

The Bulletin publicly thanks all members of the Liturgy Club for accepting the responsibility of October adoration. Unselfishly members have donated their time for soliciting halls and posting adoration notices. The response has been gratifying.

The term "liturgy' is generally thought to mean nothing more than rubrics, candles, incense, beautiful vestments. It is much more than that. For it is the worship of God--the official, public prayer of the Mystical Body of Christ adoring its invisible Head, Jesus Christ.

One of the objects of the present-day liturgical movement is to give the laity a better understanding of the Liturgy itself and a better opportunity for participating in the Sacrifice of the Mass.

You participate in the Mass by praying it with the priest and by using the daily missal. Liturgy Club members will sponsor <u>instructions</u> in the use of the missal to help you follow the priest not only through the invariable parts of the Mass but through its changing Introits, Orations, Epistles, Graduals, Gospels, Offertories, Communions. (Time and place of instructions to be announced later...Daily missals may be purchased at the offices of the prefects of religion or at the Book Store.)

Mass and Communion: the very best of all forms of active participation in the Mass is the reception of Holy Communion. Do not lose sight of this--the Mass is not only a Sacrifice but a Sacrifice which includes a Sacrament as an integral part. By receiving Holy Communion you participate in the Eucharistic Sacrifice as actively as did the

Apostles at the Last Supper. "Take ye, and eat. This is my body." Matt. xxvi, 26.
