Next Sunday's Preacher.

Father Patrick Peyton, C.S.C., the Apostle of the Family Rosary Crusade that has already swept western Canada and Alaska will preach at all the Masses. In his own simple but fervent way he will tell you why today's Family Rosary Crusade has been hailed the world's greatest hope. As a means of doing this, nothing could be more effective than the universal restoration to home life of the practice of daily family prayer--the daily Family Rosary. For the family that prays together stays together."
