## Listen To This Man Pray:

"O Lord, Thou knowest that I have nine houses in the city of South Bend, and likewise that I have lately purchased an estate in fee simple in the county of Laporte. Lord, I beseech Thee to preserve the counties of St. Joseph and Laporte from fires and earthquakes!

"And I have mortgages in Niles, I beg of Thee likewise to have an eye of compassion on that village. And, Lord, for the rest of the neighborhood, Thou mayest deal with it as Thou art pleased!

"O Lord, enable the bank to honor all checks always, and make all my debtors honest men. ## It's Slightly Ridiculous. . .

You keep telling yourself. But, if the truth were known, there may be portions of that prayer in our own hearts, whether we care to admit it or not. Bishop Fulton J. Sheen suggests a good antidote:

"The only really unhappy people in the world are the selfish! The emptying of

self, as Our Lord emptied Himself in becoming man, is the first condition of being happy.

"In each of us is something good and something bad. The good helps to get rid of the bad by making a <u>sacrifice</u> of what we <u>have</u>, in order that we may <u>be</u> what God wants us to be.

"But sacrifice for what? To bring the knowledge and love of Our Lord, His Blessed Mother, and the Church, to those in our poor missions at home and elsewhere, all of whom are yet stumbling to the light."

Our Holy Father calls such sacrifices "the charity that surpasses all other charities as heaven surpasses earth, and eternity, time."
