Look At This:

In Belfast, Northern Ireland, a first class political row has arisen over 13 council workmen of Enniskillen, all Catholics, who were fired from their jobs for taking time off on New Year's day to attend Mass. The 13 have been refused unemployment benefits for "industrial misconduct" and are living on national assistance funds. They left work through a misunderstanding, believing the council's timekeeper had given them permission to leave. Joseph Stewart, anti-partitionist, said that no public body in the north would dare dismiss men who took time off to attend meetings of the Orange order. He asked that these men be re-instated. But the council refused.

At Notre Dame -- on any Sunday morning, you will find about three hundred men, all able-bodied men, with no work at all to do -- save to roll out of their beds within the shadow of the church itself -- tripping into Mass late. Once arrived, they stand idly, gazing about for some diversion, when they ought to be following the Mass with a missal. The spectacle adds nothing to the stature of a university mind in a Catholic atmosphere.

Try to keep the Irish in Northern Ireland eway from Mass-- and you'll have a good fight on your hands, cost what it may :

Try to keep the Irish of Notre Dame -- Fighting Irish, that is -- away from Mass on Sunday morning! Well, sir, you'll find they're pushovers!! Not all of them mind you; but far too many. For, after all, even one of this kind is too many.

Lent is upon us. And one of the first and best resolutions we can make is to do well those things we are already commanded to do -- before taking on additional tasks in an effort to please God, and whittle down our Purgatory.
