Last Evening Mass

Tonight at 5:10 in Sacred Heart Church, we have the last Evening Mass -- a privilege inaugurated at Notre Dame during Lent, this year, and very well attended.

Hall Chapels Will Be Closed

The rubrics do not permit the use of the hall chapels during the last three days of Holy Week. On Thursday, Friday, and Saturday, all services will be held in Sacred Heart Church. Holy Communion will not be distributed outside of Mass beyond tomorrow noon. Note the hours of services on the Holy Week list. Holy Communion is not distributed at all on Good Friday -- except to the dying.

The One Exception

There will be a <u>Mass for Employees</u> on Holy Thursday at 7:00 a.m. in Dillon Hall Chapel. Permission was granted for this special Mass to accommodate those who have to be at work by 8:00 o'clock. Holy Communion will be distributed <u>during Mass only</u> -- as the rubrics prescribe.

Holy Week Services -- Sacred Heart Church

Masses: Holy Thursday, 7:00 a.m. Good Friday, 8:00 a.m. Holy Saturday, 7:30 a.m. (Services begin at 6:00 a.m., with Blessings, Prophecies, etc.)

Tenebrae: Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday, at 7:30 p.m.

Way of the Cross: Friday at 3 p.m., followed by Benediction with the relic of the True Cross.

Nocturnal Adoration: Watch is kept before the Blessed Sacrament in the Lady Chapel from after Mass on Thursday until Mass on Good Friday.

Easter Sunday Masses

There are no student Masses, properly speaking. But students who remain on campus are expected to attend one of the parish Masses at 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10:00 and 11:15. After Easter: daily Mass in Dillon at 7:15.

Keep Holy Week Holy

It will be good to get home for Easter -- away from Indiana -- and blizzards -- and books -- and campus characters! It will be good to see the family, and sit down to a tablecloth and linen napkin, perhaps. Have a good rest; and have a good visit with the family. Let them see you a little oftener than at mealtimes. It would be edifying to both Our Lady and your family, if you attended services in your parish church during the next three days.
