

WE PRESENT below the Lenten Regulations for the Diocese of Fort Wayne. Here at Notre Dame, however, students, faculty, residents, employees, and visitors are dispensed from fast and abstinence when eating at the University or in Vetville. Off-campus students also enjoy the dispensation, provided they avoid scandal.

LENT MEANS PRAYER AND PENANCE. It is a season of grace. It cannot possibly be observed in any proper sense of the word and with any real spiritual profit without personal sacrifice and self-denial for the love of Christ crucified. Let us be prepared for nothing less, for nothing less is enough.

- 1. LENT BEGINS on Ash Wednesday, February 11th, and ends at midnight of Holy Saturday, March 28th.
- 2. EVERYONE over 7 years of age must ABSTAIN from meat on the days prescribed.
- 3. COMPLETE ABSTINENCE must be observed on Ash Wednesday and all Fridays. This means no meat at all and nothing made from meat.
- 4. PARTIAL ABSTINENCE must be observed on Ember Wednesday and Ember Saturday, February 18th and February 21st. This means that meat is allowed only once, at the principal meal.
- 5. EVERYONE over 21 and under 59 years of age must also FAST as well as ABSTAIN.
- 6. The FAST DAYS during Lent are all weekdays, including Holy Saturday.
- 7. ON THESE DAYS only one full meal is allowed. At this one meal meat may be taken, except on days of complete abstinence, (Ash Wednesday and all Fridays.) In addition to the one full meal two lighter meals without meat are permitted. They should not equal another full meal.
- 8. EATING BETWEEN MEALS violates the law of fasting. Liquids, however, such as milk and fruit juices, are allowed.
- 9. WHEN HEALTH OR WORK would be seriously affected by fasting, the law does not oblige. In doubt consult your parish priest or confessor.
- 10. PLEASE NOTE: A clear understanding of the difference between FAST and ABSTINENCE will settle the usual difficulties. Those who, for any reason, are not obliged to FAST, must still observe the law of ABSTINENCE. Hence, while they may eat meat more than once on FAST days, they may eat no meat at all on days of COMPLETE ABSTINENCE, (Ash Wednesday and all Fridays), and they may eat meat only once on days of PARTIAL ABSTINENCE (Ember Wednesday and Saturday).


