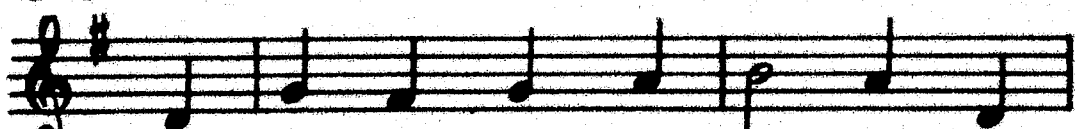

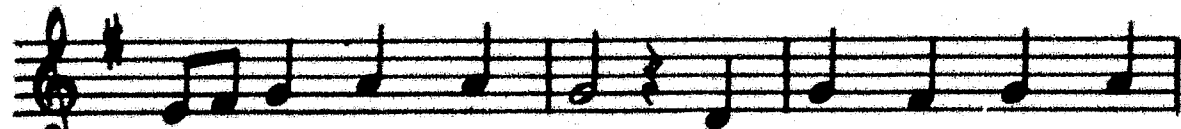

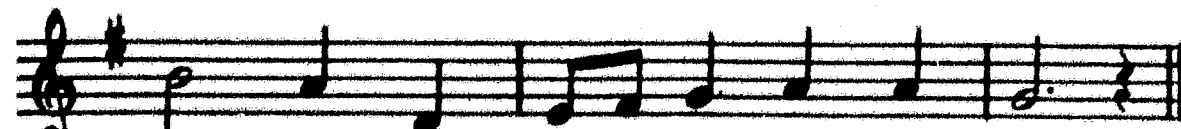

ONE OF THE LAST OFFICIAL ACTS of the late beloved Holy Father, Pope Pius XII, was to approve the Instruction of the Sacred Congregation of Rites, issued September 3, 1958, concerning the participation of the laity in the offering of Holy Mass. Holy Mass must not be what it so often is allowed to be—an individual and isolated service. It must be for all of us what St. Augustine called it—the bond of unity drawing us all closer to Our Lord and closer to each other in the living realization of our common membership in His Mystical Body.
