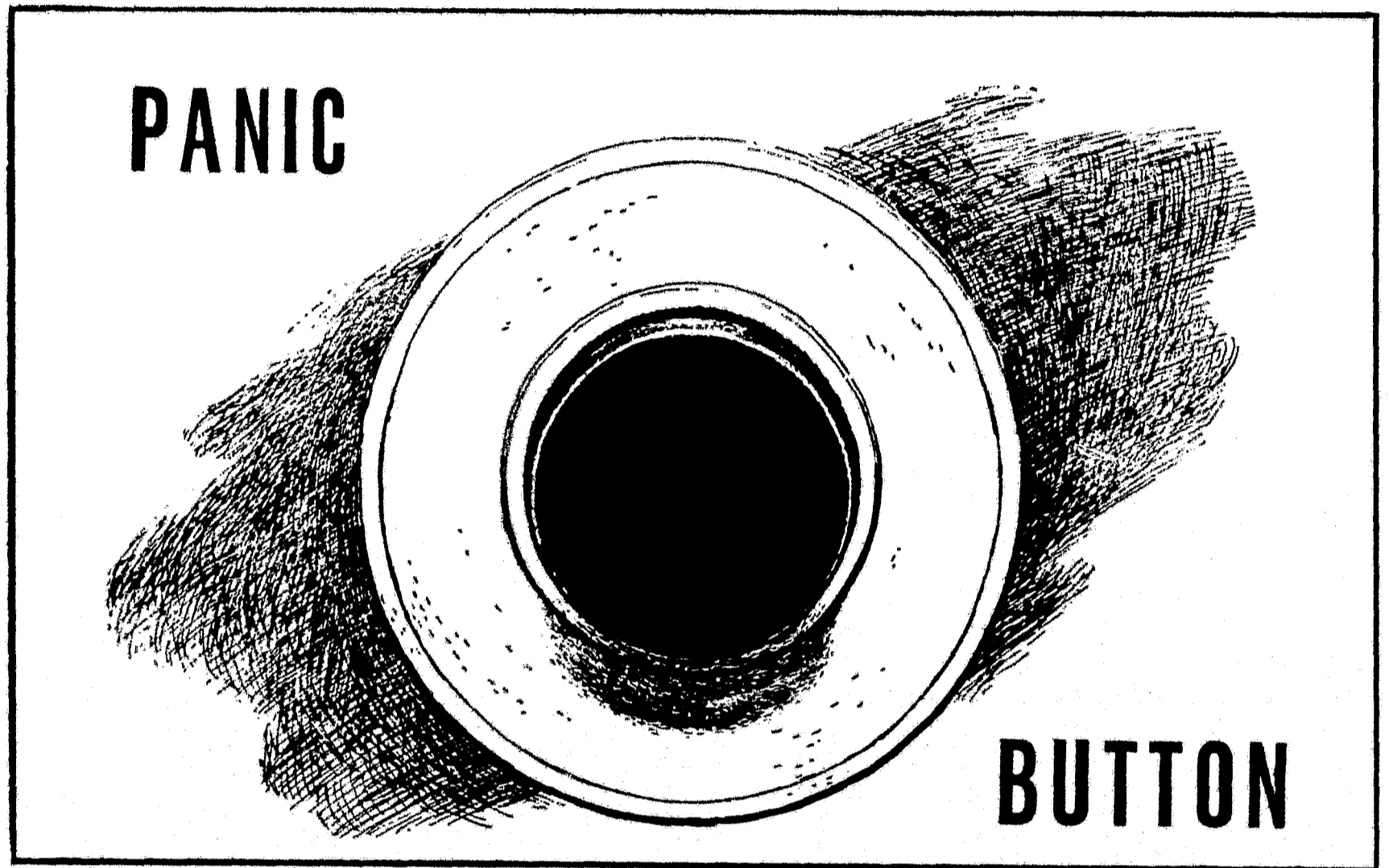

MEN WHO ARE DEDICATED TO OUR LADY should never forget that in God's plan of salvation Mary has a very important part. And it is God's design that no one will contribute as much as Our Lady in the reconciliation of the "other sheep" to the Fold of the Good Shepherd. It is fitting, therefore, that in preparation for the Chair of Unity Octave, as many as possible enroll in the League of Prayer for Unity.

League of Prayer for Unity

THIS LEAGUE is a pious union for prayers and good works established

(1) To increase interest in the Chair of Unity Octave and to sustain this interest throughout the year so that continual prayer would be offered for the return to Catholic Unity of those outside the fold; (2) The urgency of the times and the widespread interest among non-Catholics in Christian Unity.

Purposes: The purposes of the League of Prayer for Unity are the offering of prayer and sacrifices for (1) the conversion of non-Catholics; (2) the return of lapsed Catholics to the faith; (3) the speedy realization of the missionary objectives of the Catholic Church; (4) the strengthening of the virtues of faith, hope, and charity—the internal bonds of unity—among the faithful.

Duties: (1) To recite the Chair of Unity Octave prayer (prayer to Our Lady is recommended, but optional); (2) To observe publicly, if possible, the Chair of Unity Octave, January 18-25; (3) To offer other prayers and good works for the cause of Christian Unity.

League Prayer

Chair of Unity Prayer: That they all may be one as Thou Father in Me and I in Thee, that they also may be one in Us, that the world may believe that Thou hast sent Me.

V. I say unto thee that thou art Peter.

R. And upon this Rock I will build My Church.

Let us pray: O Lord Jesus Christ, Who saidst unto Thine Apostles: Peace I leave with you, My Peace I give unto you, regard not our sins, but the faith of Thy Church and grant unto her that peace and unity which are agreeable to Thy will. Who livest and reignest God forever and ever. Amen. (300 days indul.)

Indulgences for the Unity League

The Indulgences granted for the "League of Prayer for Unity under the Patronage of Our Lady of the Atonement" are the following:

I. Plenary indulgences to be gained under the usual conditions:

- a) by the faithful, on day of enrollment in League;
- b) by converted non-Catholics, on the day when they make abjuration of sect;
- c) Once a month by those who observe daily the pious practice "Ut omnes unum sint" (Rac. 622) or who recite devoutly the invocation, "Our Lady of the Atonement intercede for us that the prayer of thy Divine Son may be fulfilled: That all may be one" each day of the month.

A partial indulgence of 300 days, to be gained each time by those who at least with a contrite heart

Recite the above mentioned prayer or the cited pious practice; Perform any work of piety or charity for the purpose of the pious union.
