THE ALUMINUM PLAQUE pictured below is one you have passed many times, if you've been to the Grotto very often. The indulgences listed here were first granted during the centennial year celebrating Our Lady's apparition at Lourdes. A few words about these indulgences may be in order as we again approach the Feast of Our Lady's Apparition at Lourdes. The Church celebrates the feast on Saturday, February 11th.

THE PRAYERS--an Our Father, Hail Mary, and Glory be to the Father-are to be said for the intention of the Holy Father. THE GROUP--three or more individuals--may gain the indulgence at any time any day. However, it is necessary that the members of the group also attend Mass and receive Holy Communion during the eight days before or after the visit.



A PARTIAL INDULGENCE of 500 days may be gained by any individual visiting the Grotto at any time any day. Requisite for gaining the indulgence is a contrite heart and the offering of your prayers--an Our Father, Hail Mary, and Glory be to the Father--for the intention of the Holy Father.

THE INDULGENCE gained either by the members of the group or by the individual visiting the Grotto alone may be applied to oneself or to another person who is living or deceased.

THE INDULGENCES stem from the establishment here at Notre Dame of the Confraternity of the Immaculate Conception of Our Lady of Lourdes. All should belong and can join by sending in the form

> on the other side of today's Bulletin. Do so today, however. You may gain a Plenary Indulgence the day you enroll, and again on Saturday, the feast of Our Lady's Apparition. Founded here in 1874, the Confraternity has thousands of members around the world.
