The Second Sunday of the Passion, Palm Sunday, is like PALM SUNDAY a great door opening on the holy mysteries of Easter. In the Church's official prayer, it is not a week of sorrowful lament and mourning. Rather, throughout it there is an undercurrent of joy and victory, a consciousness that following upon the Sacred Passion will come Easter glory. So, the procession (from the Grotto to the Church) before the 11:00 o'clock Mass on Sunday should be viewed as a display rich in symbolism. Christ will be present in three ways. 1) In a symbol, on the cross at the head of the procession; 2) in His representative, the priest; 3) in all present, gathered together in His name ("... there am I in the midst of you.") The procession will begin at 10:45 at the Grotto, and should be a reminder of the day when we hope to enter heaven with Christ Our King. It is a rehearsal, in other words, of the Last Day. The palms distributed at all the Masses Sunday will not possess any power or virtue of their own. They aren't instruments of Magic. Rather, they are "visible signs of the powerful prayer of God's Church which calls down the blessing of God upon all places where they are put."

LOW SUNDAY For the benefit of those who will be travelling all day Sunday, April 29th, returning from the Easter vacation, there will be a Mass at 7:00 P.M. in Sacred Heart Church.
