If one;'s own performance has been poorer or below-standard, let him take care lest his condition worsen over the summer. And, let him shape up quickly when he returns in September. If one's performance has been better than that of the previous year, be grateful for the graces received and keep up the effort. Whether better or worse, though, try to determine why. And, if time permits, write and tell us.

And for all of you who will be driving during the summer, one last reminder about the self-discipline necessary to insure conforming with the established rules.
