At 8:00 p.m. in the Law auditorium ten of the nation's leading Scriptural scholars, Catholic and Protestant, will participate in a panel discussion on "Current Developments in Sacred Scripture."

Protestant scholars scheduled for the meeting are: Dr. Krister Stendahl, Harvard University Divinity School; Dr. Bruce M. Metzger, Princeton Theological Seminary; Dr. Frank M. Cross, Harvard University; and Dr. Robert Grant, University of Chicago Divinity School.

There is good news on the Catholic news front. The first Catholic news magazine is about to start publication. It will be called <u>Report</u>, it will come out monthly, it will contain news, not opinion. <u>Report</u> will not cover merely Catholic news; it is to be a news magazine that covers the news of the world, drawing on news sources all over the world.

<u>Report</u>'s objective is to supply news under four aspects -- the news as it exists immediately, the news as it exists in relation to the vertical of history, the news as it relates to the horizontal of other news happening at the same time, and, most important, the news as it relates to eternal values.

Bernard Browne, completing work on his doctorate here at Notre Dame, is one of the associate editors of the new publication. The editor will be Dr. Carl Schmitt who has his doctorate in history from Harvard and

C.S.C., Holy Cross College, Washington, D.C.; Rev. Carroll Stuhlmueller, C.P., Passionist Seminary, Louisville, Kentucky; Rev. Roland E. Murphy, O. Carm., Catholic University of America; Rev. Roderick MacKenzie, S.J., Woodstock College, Maryland; and Rev. Guy Courturier, C.S.C., Notre Dame of Holy Cross, Sainte Genevieve, Quebec, Canada.

Notre Dame's theology department head, Father Robert Pelton, a member of the religious community which "stands in fear of all new expression", made arrangements for this panel long before a student voice was raised. who has studied in France and Italy.
