JESUS IS REJECTED BY JUST ABOUT EVERYONE. YET, JESUS TELLS US TO BE READY FOR HIM. The end of the first semester coincides with the end of the Liturgical Year, Thanksgiving, and Advent. Before we know it we will be celebrating Christmas. We will be so preoccupied with ending the semester well that we could easily miss the season. BUT WHY NOT USE OUR STUDIES PREOCCUPATION AS A MEANS TO CELEBRATE THE COMING OF CHRIST? Let us dedicate our many study hours as a preparation for letting Jesus in at Christmas and let us punctuate our studies with short prayer, Eucharist, and "Confession". Prepare the way!

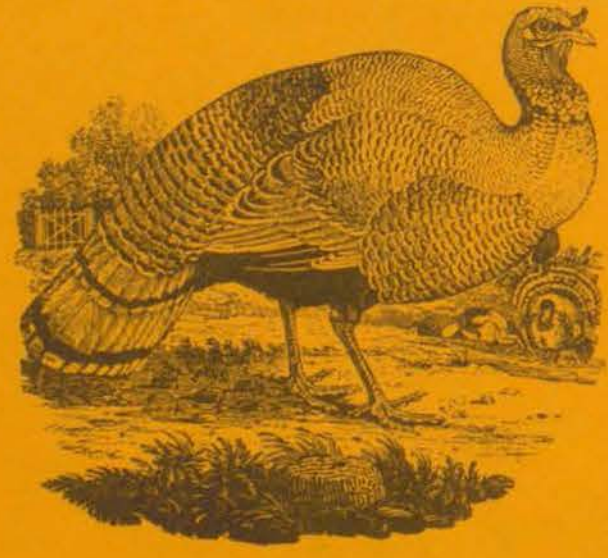
