Shadow Lately For Hate?

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## FORGIVENESS SUNDAY

Who needs forgiveness? Who needs to forgive? Jesus is telling us in HIS WORD in today's scripture that we all do and that forgiveness of one another is a prerequisite for God's friendship. God is with us in so far as we are forgiving persons.

Allen Bloom in his recent best seller, <u>The</u> <u>Closing of the American Mind</u>, tells us that when he asks his college students what they think of evil, these students often come up blank. Apparently they/we have a dull or dim sense of the evil in and around us.

It seems that HATE is one evil that immerses us, one another and communally. Hate expressed in anger, suspicion, envy, dislike for another's opinion, fear of another's disfavor, grudges, vengeance, and many more evil expressions seems to be a part of the evil side of each of us, a part of our shadow. The Lord is telling us to reduce that shadow, to eliminate or minimize our hate by asking and giving forgiveness from our hearts.

## Let us listen:

"Resentment and anger, these are foul things too..." the book of Sirach

"The Life and death of each of us has its influence on others..." St. Paul in Romans

"...unless you forgive your neighbor from your heart..." Jesus in Matthew

The unforgiving heart festers and brings about useless and unproductive attitudes to life and people. I must begin again and again to search for the hate that is in my heart and from the bottom of my heart to seek and to offer forgiveness. It should be easy to do this since we are all sinners in this way. We all have some of this evil in our hearts, we all realize how difficult it is to seek and to give forgiveness. We don't know how the other will accept our change of heart. That's the chance we take. That is what Jesus is asking us to do. Forgiveness is a conversion, a change of heart, and an instant deeper awareness of God.

I search my heart for those I resent and for those I know I have offended:

I let my resentment go and forgive from the bottom of my heart. I even accept in my heart the other person who may not accept me. I FORGIVE. GOD IS WITH ME.
