The Rosary of the Blessed Virgin Mary

The Rosary is a way of meditating on the meaning of Jesus' life, death and resurrection. Its 15 mysteries are arranged in groups of five and follow the historical sequence of his life and that of his blessed mother. Each decade of the Rosary is made up of one Our Father, ten Hail Marys and one Glory. The constant repetition of the same vocal prayers and the use of Rosary beads help set up a rhythm favorable to peaceful, recollected prayer.

Many people use one or more of the following methods to help concentrate on the mysteries:

1. Read one of the bible passages suggested below before each decade;
2. Add a suitable phrase to the first half of the Hail Mary each time it is said;
3. Make an extemporaneous meditation before each decade.

THE JOYFUL MYSTERIES

1. The Annunciation of the Angel Gabriel to Mary Luke 1:26-38/ Isaiah 7:10-14

Hail, Mary, . . . and blessed is the fruit of your womb, Jesus, who was conceived at the message of an angel.

2. The Visitation of Mary to Elizabeth Luke 1:39-45/ John 1:19-23/ Isaiah 40:1-10

Hail, Mary, . . . the fruit of your womb, Jesus, who sanctified the Baptist in the womb of his mother.

3. The Birth of Jesus in Bethlehem of Judea Luke 2:1-20/ Matthew 2:1-12/ Micah 5:1-5/ Galatians 4:1-7

Hail, Mary, . . . the fruit of your womb, Jesus, who was born for us in the stable of Bethlehem.

4. The Presentation of Christ in the Temple Luke 2:22-32/ Hebrews 9:6-14

5. The Finding of Christ in the Temple Luke 2:41-50/ 1 Corinthians 2:6-16/ John 12:44-50

Hail, Mary, . . . the fruit of your womb, Jesus, the power and the wisdom of God.

THE SORROWFUL MYSTERIES

1. The Agony of Jesus in the Garden of Gethsemane Matthew 26:36-46/ Mark 14:26-42/ Luke 22:39-53/ John 18:1-12

Hail, Mary, . . . the fruit of your womb, Jesus, who sweat blood in the garden of Gethsemane.

2. The Scourging of Jesus at the Pillar Matthew 27:15-26/ Mark 16:6-16/ Isaiah 50:5-9

Hail, Mary, . . . the fruit of your womb, Jesus, who was bruised for our offenses.

3. The Crowning of Jesus with Thorns Matthew 27:27-31/ Mark 15:16-19/ Luke 23:6-11/ John 19:1-7/ Isaiah 52:13-53:10/ Matthew 16:24-28

Hail, Mary, . . . the fruit of your womb, Jesus, a man of sorrows and acquainted with grief.

4. The Way of the Cross Mark 16:20-25/ John 19:17-22/ Philippians 2:6-11/ Mark 8:31-38

Hail, Mary, . . . the fruit of your womb, Jesus, who was crushed for our sins.

5. The Crucifixion and Death of Jesus Mark 15:33-39/ John 19:17-37/ Hebrews 9:11-14/ Acts 22:22-24

Hail, Mary, . . . the fruit of your womb, Jesus, by whose wounds we are healed.

THE GLORIOUS MYSTERIES

1. The Resurrection of Christ from the Dead Mark 16:1-8/ Matthew 28:1-10/ Luke 24:1-11/ John 20:1-10/ 1 Corinthians 15:1-11/ Romans 6:1-14

Hail, Mary, . . . the fruit of your womb,

Jesus, who died for our sins and rose for our justification.

2. The Ascension of Christ into Heaven Matthew 28:16-20/ Luke 24:44-53/ Acts 1:1-11/ Ephesians 2:4-7

Hail, Mary, . . . the fruit of your womb, Jesus, who now sits at the right hand of the Father.

3. The Gift of the Holy Spirit: Pentecost Acts 2:1-11/ Acts 4:23-31/ Acts 11:44-48/ John 14:15-21

Hail, Mary, . . . the fruit of your womb, Jesus, who bequeathed us the Holy Spirit as he had promised.

4. The Falling Asleep and Assumption of Our Lady Revelations 21:1-6/ John 11:17-27/ 1 Corinthians 15:20-28/ 1 Corinthians 15:42-50/ 1 Corinthians 15:51-57

Hail, Mary, . . . the fruit of your womb, Jesus, who makes all things new.

5. The Coronation of Our Lady and the Glory of All the Saints Revelation 21:1-6/ Revelation 7:1-4, 9-12/ Matthew 5:1-12

Hail, Mary, . . . the fruit of your womb, Jesus, who will come again in glory with all his saints.
