


"we need...the techniques of changing passive Christians into active Chritians."

THAT KIND OF REACTION IS COMING. THEY MAY NOT LIVE THEIR FAITH TO THE BEST OF THEIR ABILITY, BUT THEY ARE ALIVE TO THE MYSTERY OF GOD'S PRESENCE IN THE WORLD."
