

"Speak, Lord, Your servant is listening."

"The time has come," he said."And the kingdom of God is close at hand. Repent, and believe the Good News."

Primary to faith is ,first through baptism and then continually throughout our lives, to accept our conversion and to acknowledge that our God calls each of us to accept his son Jesus and to respond to his particular call to serve him.

Our God persisted in calling Samuel until he responded and acknowledged his God and opened himself to whatever the Lord wanted of him. Mark's gospel constantly reminds us that we need a good attitude of conversion in order to hear the call of our God.

The pitch is God calls each of us. It is up is me, to you, to be ready to respond. Our God will come to us many times and call us to conversion and service. Faith is that act, that process, of saying yes. He called Mary to be his mother. He called John and Peter from their boat. He called St. Francis in the 13th century. He calls each of today. Will I be ready for that call?
