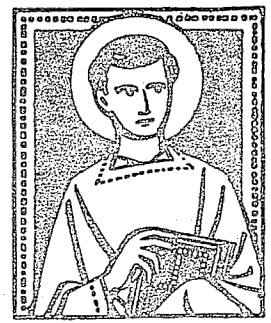

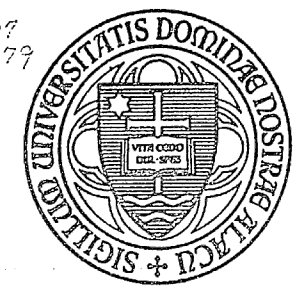
If I give away all that I possess, piece by piece, and if I even let them take my body to burn it, but am without LOVE, it will do me no good whatever.

LOVE takes no pleasure in other people's sins but delights in the truth; it is always ready to excuse, to trust, to hope, and to endure whatever comes.

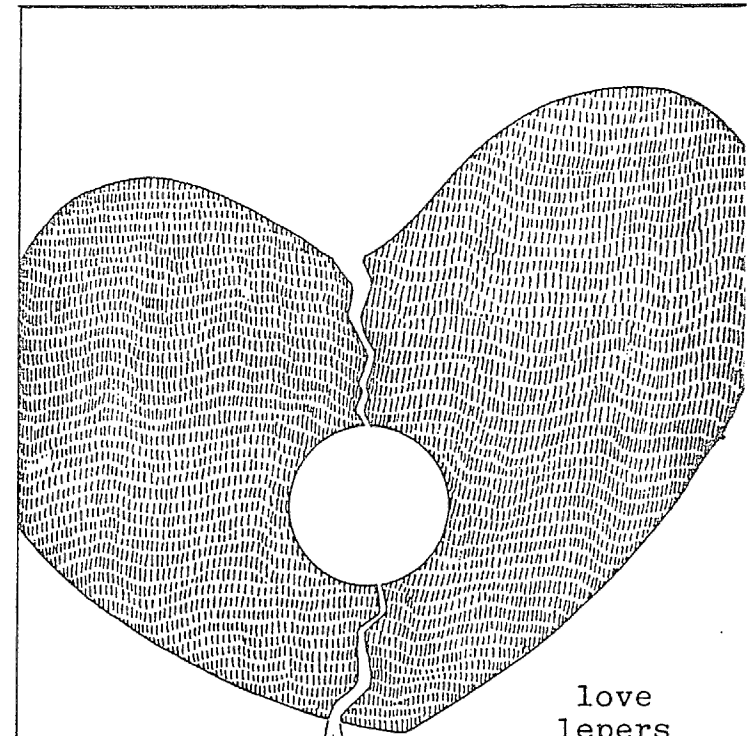

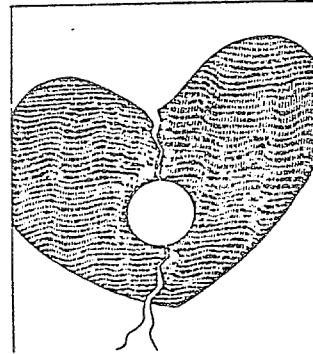
Who heals these days? Who

thoughts of last year's seniors who
are now in the Holy Cross Associates

"My placement is senior mini-
stry at St. Andrew Parish.
Generally, it entails visiting
shut-ins, providing transportation

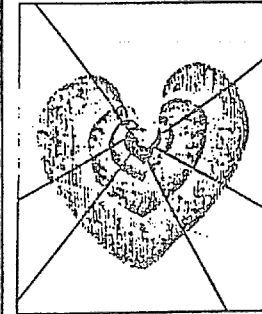
for the seniors to doctor's ap-
pointments, pharmacy, Mass and
the grocery store.... Two thoughts
that immediately come to mind about
the elderly are liveliness and lone-
liness. Many are lonely because
they have little or no network of
family or friends to care for them.
They are thankful for someone to
simply talk to. I'm thankful that
someone here at the parish discov-
ered the need for this outreach
in the neighborhood. Beyond the
worries, the complaints
and mixed-up thoughts,
the seniors I have met
are full of wisdom and
liveliness. I have felt
welcomed by them."

words many times before I left

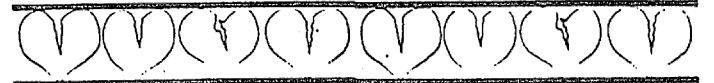
for Chile, but Matthew's
