BABY DOMERS NEED YOU

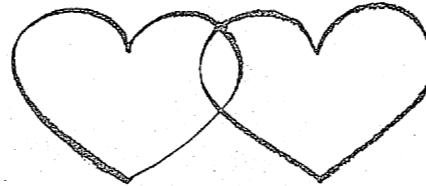

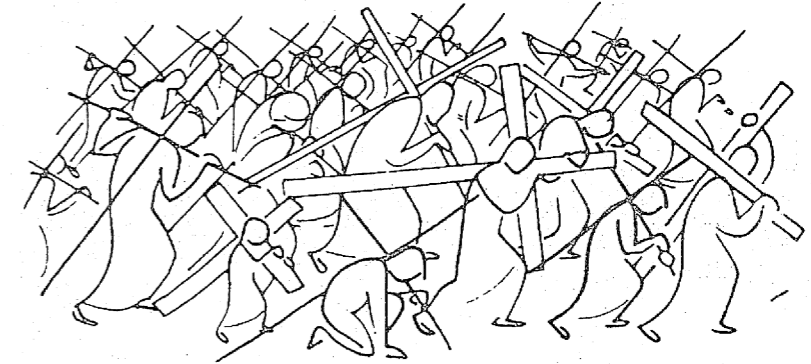

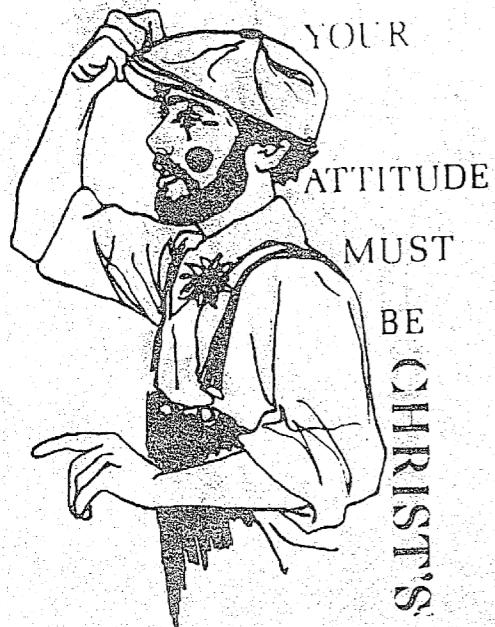

Who Wrote the Fifth Gospel?

Listening to Jesus in the four Gospels and to St. James or St Paul in their letters provides us with the early Christian impression and reaction to the person Jesus. Each of us is in turn called to respond to Jesus, to write our own Gospel or proclaim the Good News of Jesus in one's own way---my own gospel, the fifth gospel.

"Who do people say I am?" "But you," he asked, "who do you say that I am?" Am I ready to answer Jesus' question? Am I too busy? Do I avoid His question?

Peter responded, "You are the Christ."

YOU ARE THE CHRIST

St. James tells us, "...I will prove to you that I have faith by showing you my good deeds..." I write my gospel, my response to Jesus, by life style, by my participation in the Christian Community, by reaching out to others, close and far away. Imagine the change and improvement possible in our community if each of us each Sunday examined how one performed good deeds or failed to do so the past week and resolved to do so the following week. As THE CHRISTOPHERS say, "You too can change the world." Change starts with me! Christ is ready.

Maybe a starter will help? Suggestion: each RB reader some time during this coming week greets, meets, and shows interest in one stranger. Bring another the Good News and continue your gospel with a new chapter each week!
