In the beginning, Rev. Basil Moreau, C.S.C., the founder of the Congregation of Holy Cross. sent missionaries east to India and west to Indiana and those that went west seem to have gotten the better deal. That part of India where Holy Cross Priests, Brothers and Sisters went one hundred and thirty-five years ago became East Pakistan. In 1971 it then became the country of Bangladesh, as it is known today. Wars, tidal waves, droughts and now the greatest flood in recorded history, covering two-thirds of the country, have re-enforced Kissenger's claim of it being the basket case of the world. Add to this the difficulty of implanting a church in an Islamic society and administering schools such as Notre Dame College in the midst of poverty also reinforces the claim that the hundred or so Holy Cross Religious now there, most of them graduates of Notre Dame and St. Mary's, have a difficult deal indeed.

A recent letter from Father Tom Zimmerman. C.S.C., states:

"I guess the real guestion remains how much hunger there will be after three or four months. Also I wonder how the country can every really recover from the huge losses ...

"Thanks in advance for whatever assistance you can find."
