“THE TWO GENTLEMEN OF VERONA is one of Shakespeare’s earliest works and is often dismissed as a minor piece of juvenilia. The play, however, is an important work as it provides a template for so many of the themes and motifs that Shakespeare will explore throughout his life: the challenges of love, parental/child discord, disguise, ambition and betrayal, to name a few. This play poses the question: what is more essential-friendship or romantic love? Certainly a struggle that never goes out of fashion. Shakespeare remains ever current because he speaks to the human heart; he understands our complexities and contradictions. THE TWO GENTLEMEN OF VERONA is an ideal play for a university as it examines the particular struggles and behaviors of young people. However, I hope people of all ages see themselves in one way or another in this production.”
