Mr. Ball, a lawyer and investment banker, was formerly Undersecretary of State from 1961 to 1966 and United States Permanent Representative to the United Nations in 1968.

Mr. Bardeen, a Professor of Physics and Electrical Engineering at the University of Illinois, is the first person to win two Nobel Prizes in physics.


