Sent to Notre Dame by Mr. P. / Mrs. M. M. M.

I am directed by the Revd & Solon to address you concerning an order sent by him to you for payment of three hundred dollars. two hundred and fifty of which was to have been paid to Mr Parmentier of Brooklyn and the other fifty to be remitted to him, but not having heard from you, he is fearful it might have miscarried or that our Right Revd Bishop of Vincennes had not given him the right direction to you, in case of which Mr Solon begs that you will be so kind as to pay Mr Parmentier the amount stated until he can receive from the Bishop another order for the same, the reason for wishing you to do this is that we are at such a distance from Vincennes that too much delay would intervene between return of letters and Mr Parmentier's bill which ought to have been paid two months back it is now six weeks since Mr Solon sent you the Bishop's order, and he expects shortly to draw on you for the sum of five hundred dollars but if you do not wish to pay the amt to Mr P. ~~you~~ without the Bishop's order you will be pleased to write immediately so that we may procure it. but by paying Mr P. and sending the balance to us by
