APPLICATION PROCEDURE

1. Return the application forms before May 2nd directly to the Director of the Summer Session, Notre Dame, Indiana. RETURN ALL COPIES UNWASTED. DO NOT SELECT COURSES WITHOUT THE PRIOR APPROVAL OF YOUR ADVISOR. If you have not received the prior approval of your advisor, RETURN THE FORM AFTER YOU HAVE COMPLETED ALL BUT THE COURSE SCHEDULE PORTION. THIS MAY BE COMPLETED ON REGISTRATION DAY. CURRENT STUDENTS AT THE UNIVERSITY MUST APPLY FOR ADMISSION TO THE SUMMER SESSION, NOT TO THE DEAN OF THEIR COLLEGE.
2. If you have earned college credit elsewhere since your LAST attendance at the University of Notre Dame, or if you are a NEW student, you must forward TWO transcripts of this work to the Director of the Summer Session, University of Notre Dame, BEFORE YOU WILL BE ADMITTED OR PERMITTED TO REGISTER.
3. AFTER THE APPLICATION FORM IS RETURNED, CHANGES MAY NOT BE MADE UNTIL YOU ARRIVE ON CAMPUS. ADVANCE REQUESTS FOR AUDITS WILL NOT BE HONORED. YOU MAY APPLY FOR AUDITS AFTER YOU ARRIVE ON CAMPUS AND REGISTER. AUDITS COST \$25.00 PER SEMESTER HOUR.

4. You will receive from the Office of Student Accounts a "Statement of Account" which will also specify the registration procedures. To save yourself much inconvenience on REGISTRATION DAY - WEDNESDAY, JUNE 17, 1964 - you are urged to return the APPLICATION FORM by May 2, 1964 and to pay your fees by Wednesday, June 3, 1964. A late application fee of \$10.00 is applicable after May 2, 1964.

GENERAL INFORMATION

5. DO NOT CONTACT ANY OTHER OFFICE EXCEPT THE DIRECTOR OF THE SUMMER SESSION UNTIL AFTER YOUR COPY OF THE COMPLETED APPLICATION HAS BEEN RETURNED TO YOU.
6. NO COMMITMENTS FOR ROOMS, CLASSES OR OTHER FACILITIES WILL BE HONORED UNLESS THE DIRECTOR OF THE SUMMER SESSION HAS PROCESSED YOUR APPLICATION FORM AND RETURNED A COPY OF THE FORM TO YOU. NO COMMITMENTS BY ANY ONE EXCEPT THE DIRECTOR OF THE SUMMER SESSION WILL BE HONORED.
7. DO NOT ARRIVE ON CAMPUS PRIOR TO THE AFTERNOON OF JUNE 16, 1964 since University facilities are committed. The dormitories will be occupied and space will not be available.
8. INFORMATION CONCERNING THE NUMBERING OF COURSES; THE TIME SCHEDULE WILL BE FOUND ON PAGE 7.

REGISTRATION INSTRUCTIONS

9. IF YOUR FEES WERE NOT PAID PRIOR TO WEDNESDAY, JUNE 3, 1964, you must begin registration by REPORTING TO THE OFFICE OF STUDENT ACCOUNTS on the ground floor, Administration Building (Gold Dome) to clear your account.
10. If your fees were paid by Wednesday, June 3, 1964, you may register at O'Shaughnessy Hall by reporting at the time prescribed on page 7.
11. ALL STUDENTS MUST HAVE A TUITION CERTIFICATE (BLUE) AS EVIDENCE OF PAYMENT OF FEES BEFORE THEY MAY REGISTER FOR COURSES OR TO USE UNIVERSITY FACILITIES.
12. PERMISSION FOR LATE REGISTRATION MUST BE OBTAINED IN ADVANCE FROM THE DIRECTOR OF THE SUMMER SESSION AND WILL BE GRANTED UNDER SPECIAL CIRCUMSTANCES ONLY. THERE IS A FEE OF \$10.00 IN ALL CASES.
